# 2 NOV DINING-IN INFORMATION & FAQ's

#### 1. What is a Dining-In?

The Dining-In is a formal dinner for the members of a wing, unit, or organization. Although a Dining-In is traditionally a unit function, attendance by other smaller units may be appropriate.

#### 2. When is the Dining-In?

The Dining-In is scheduled for 2 November 2013. The reception/cocktail hour begins at 1700hrs with the ceremony starting promptly at 1800hrs. We anticipate the Dining-In concluding at approximately 2200hrs.

#### 3. Are buses available to and from the Dining-In?

Unfortunately, buses will not be available for use. The Cape Codder Resort has discounted a block of rooms for \$89 for the evening. If you plan on drinking it is encouraged that you stay or utilize a designated driver.

### 7. Do I have to drink alcohol at this event?

You do not have to consume any alcohol during any part of the Dining-In. During cocktail hour you are allowed to drink whatever YOU want (water, soda, etc.). During the ceremony the tables will be set with white wine, red wine and water. If you need to make a trip to the Grog Bowl, there will be an alcoholic and non-alcoholic version.
